



Title: Yoga Shibir

Goal:

The Aim of the Practice:

- To avoid stress and live healthy life
- To refrain students from anger, restlessness, boredom, frustration, excessive worry etc.
- To concentrate more on qualitative study
- To get physical as well as mental happiness and make the students free from stress and problems of life.

The Context:

Prof. B.G. Parmar, Department of Gujarati participated in Yoga Training Camp at Patanjali Yoga Vidyapith, Haridwar as a representative of Sabarkantha district in 2007-08. He took complete training under the supervision of Baba Ramdevjee. Principal Dr. V.N. Raval, keeping in mind the Yoga skills of Dr. B.G. Parmar and his interest in teaching Yoga to the sudents, framed a Yoga & Health Committee in the college with Dr. B.G. Parmar as Convener, and five faculty from different departments as members. The committee decided to give Yoga training to the college students. Thereby, the Yoga Shibir was organized during the Second Term; the college students were given the training for Yoga skills early in the morning from 7.00 a.m. to 8.00 a.m. for a week by the Yoga & Health Committee.

Such practice helps them to initiate the process of teaching yoga to people in their area. It thus, focuses on the scope of social activity at various levels on the part of the students. Total participants were 324 in the academic year 2014-15.

Evidence of Success:

- The students participate actively in yoga programme and ready to extend the programme for more days.
- The students enjoy good health and mental peace.
- After getting the Yoga training successfully by the end of their college study, they teach yoga to different people in their nearby houses, streets and areas and thereby grab the opportunity to serve the community and get blessed.
- The Students and people have found this yoga awareness programmes very useful and informative for life, also a means of livelihood.
- Some of the students visited Patanjali Yoga Vidyapeeth Haridwar and got training and blessings of Swami Ramdevjee.
- The activity of Yoga has been appreciated by the college authority and college management. Moreover, all the news agencies took notice of this activity and made it a news into their news papers.

Resources Required:

- The students who are interested in Yoga exercise voluntarily
- Mike, mattress and Banner
- Convener and members of Yoga and Health committee as trainers

Problems Encountered and Solutions:

- In the beginning it was difficult to convince the students to spare extra time for such activity.
- The students commuting from villages faced difficulties in the beginning due to unavailability of S.T. buses early in the morning.

- Yoga activity was scheduled from 7.00 a.m. to 8.00 a.m. keeping in mind the students commuting from rural area.
- With the celebration of International Yoga Day on 21st June 2015, more awareness of Yoga came among students and they enthusiastically joined this activity.
- Yoga committee continuously tries its best to avert the difficulties of the students.

Title: Spoken English Course for college students

Goal:

- To enable the college students to talk in English
- To guide them to learn English language and communicate in it
- To enable them to develop accuracy and fluency in communication
- To make them free from psychological fear and develop confidence among them.

The aim of the practice:

Department of English is one of the most dynamic departments in the college. The institute offers graduation and post graduation degree programme in English. The Department of English consists of four full time lecturers. The institute always tries to cater to the need of the students. The chief aim of this course was to satisfy the demand of the students of final year of graduation who lacked proficiency in speaking English.

The Context:

The existing situation of the college as well as the town states the lack of proficiency of communicative skills among the students. As everyone knows good communicative skills are essential in today's competitive world for building career in any field. Of course, there are number of so called spoken English courses available in the market, but there also they fail to learn the basic skills of communication. So, the D.E.L.L. tries to cater to the needs of the college students. The SCOPE Only Assessment Scheme registration was kept open for all the students, who study in the college. The course was of two week duration i.e. from 11 to 24 April 2014.

The Practice:

- The practice is unique as the proficiency of communicative skills is the need of today.
- The course made them familiar with all the four basic language learning skills Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing.
- It made them free from psychological fear and other barriers.
- It helped them to feel self-assured and confident.

• The course helped them to get enough practice to appear in SCOPE examination and have Cambridge University Certificate.

Evidence of Success:

- The students who opt for only assessment scheme to appear in SCOPE examination have found this course very useful for their career and expected result in SCOPE examination.
- 24 students were registered for the course and all of them enthusiastically attended the class.
- It proved blessing for the students who belong to economically backward classes as it is not affordable for them to get admission in D.E.L.L. to study English language skills.
- All the students participated interestingly in the programme and are ever eager and enthusiastic to attend such more programmes.

- A class room and D.E.L.L.
- Enthusiastic and scholar teachers
- Projector, CDs, White Board etc.

Problems Encountered and Solutions:

- In the beginning the students felt awkward to spare extra time for such activity.
- All the students who joined the course of Spoken English have found it very useful.
- It is comparatively more important for the rural students as the lack of communicative skill often cause an obstacle in building their social and professional career.
- All of them participate keenly in such programmes and ready to attend such more programmes.
